

**TERRY BURRELL\*** (BILLIE HOLIDAY) [SHE/HER] is a stage actor of West Indian-American descent. Terry's Broadway credits include *Three Penny Opera, Thoroughly Modern Millie, Swinging On A Star,* Stephen Sondheim's *Into The Woods,* Michael Bennett's *Dreamgirls, Honky Tonk Nights, Eubie* and the first London production of *Showboat* as Julie. In regional theatre Terry was nominated for the Suzi Bass Best

Actress and Playwright for her portrayal of Ethel Waters in Ethel, a Helen Hayes Best Actress in a Musical for her portrayal of Queenie in Duke Ellington's Queenie Pie, and a Suzi Bass Best Actress in a Musical for her portrayal of Billie Holiday in Lady Day At Emerson's Bar And Grill. Other regional credits include the role of Marie in Ever After, The Old Woman in Candide, Aldonza in Man Of La Mancha, Eve in Arthur Miller's Up From Paradise, Diana Deveraux in Of Thee I Sing, Glenda/Aunt Em in The Wiz, Ella in Bubbling Brown Sugar, Maydee in Jar the Floor, Good Sister in Thunder Knockin' At The Door, Conchita in Barry Manilow's Copacabana, Mrs. Brown/Mavis in The Women of Brewster Place, The Queen/Fairy Godmother in Cinderella, Aunt Eller in Oklahoma and featured roles in Almost Heaven at the Promenade Theatre, Grand Night For Singing, Crowns, Sweet and Hot, Ain't Misbehavin', Time and Again, The World Goes Round at The West Side Arts Theatre, Sheila's Day, Sophisticated Ladies, Smokey Joes Café, Brownie Points, Angry Raucous And Shamelessly Gorgeous, Hospice/Pointing at the Moon, The Roommate, Having Our Say and Shutter Sisters. In addition, Terry is a seasoned cabaret artist who's performed her nightclub act for audiences from Monte Carlo to the Caribbean and for corporate clients like IBM, Avon, and The National Grocers Association. Her work also includes television commercials, radio voice-overs and industrials for Ford Motor Company, Searle Pharmaceuticals, Goodyear Tires, I Love New York and Schering-Plough Corporation. She first performed Backstage And Other Stories for the Roswell Arts Cultural Center and is thrilled to be doing it again for Synchronicity Theatre in her adopted city of Atlanta, GA.



**TYRONE JACKSON** (JIMMY POWERS) [HE/HIM] is the quintessential jazz piano player. His boundless creativity coupled with harmonic mastery, utilizes the piano as a blank canvas. Jackson is nationally recognized and has traveled the world as a solo artist and sideman. Born in the New Orleans cradle of jazz, Jackson embodies the spirit of the Crescent City. As a composer, Jackson has composed

original music for Pulitzer Prize winning author Natasha Tretheway's book of poems *Native Guard* turned theatrical play; Pearl Cleage's play *Tell Me My Dream*; *Ethel* by Terry Burrell; *Nick's Flamingo Grill* and *A Very Terry Christmas* at Alliance Theatre. His compositions are also featured in two documentaries and one movie (Canal Street). Jackson has recorded 4 Albums — "Dedicated," "Another Voyage," "Melody In Nede," and "From The Mind Of." Currently Tyrone Jackson is a professor at Kennesaw State University where he is lecturer of Jazz Piano and teaches a myriad of classes



including: Aural Skills III & IV, Jazz Improvisation I, II & III, Jazz Combo, Jazz Theory, Applied Jazz Piano, Group Jazz Piano and History of the Blues.



RAMON POOSER (BASS) [HE/HIM] started on violin at 8, switching to bass at 10. In a few years he added electric bass. Performing in a performing arts school opened him to a variety of music. He went on to Berklee College of Music where he performed with the MIT symphony orchestra, including a performance at Carnegie Hall with Eugene Listz. He moved to New York, performing and recording

with an eclectic group of musicians and touring Europe. He then moved back to Atlanta, Georgia where he added extensive tours of South and Central America to his resume. He composes music for tv, film, stage, and other genres as diverse as his experiences in a lengthy career.



LORENZO SANFORD (PERCUSSION) [HE/HIM] is one of the most eclectic artists on the music scene today. As a drummer, he has performed with many celebrated artists; including Stevie Wonder, Abbey Lincoln, Peabo Bryson, Melba Moore, Jennifer Holiday and Lizz Wright. His work in musical theater includes performing under the helm of acclaimed Broadway director Kenny Leon,

in Langston Hughes' *Tambourines to Glory*; under the direction of Kent Gash, in *Five Guys Named Moe*; in the Tony Award winning Alliance Theatre's production of *Tick, Tick, Boom!* and in the workshop production of *Motown The Musical*, the hit Broadway show written and produced by legendary Motown Records founder Berry Gordy, Jr. As a composer, Lorenzo holds a degree in music composition. His work "Beauty For Ashes," a composition for double quartet (string quartet and jazz quartet combined) received great acclaim as part of the grand opening concert for North Carolina's Highlands-Cashiers Chamber Music Festival. Lorenzo continues to navigate vast musical territory. His Carnegie Hall debut featured him as part of the Gary Motley Quartet, in an innovative concert with the Vega String Quartet, combining jazz and classical music. In a stint with The Mosier Brothers Band he was squarely in the mix of progressive blue grass. Lorenzo tours internationally as a guest artist and as the leader of his own group. In addition to his work with other artists, he is currently writing and producing a CD of original music that will feature an eclectic mix of his contemporary songs and vocals.



**STORM** (PEPI) also answers to Stormie. A Yorkie who's five years old, Storm loves spending time with their humans ... especially if Dad gives 'em peanut butter and Mom shares a piece of her cheese. Most of the time Storm is very sweet and obedient but is down to bark like a Rottweiler whenever the doorbell rings ... even if it's coming from the television.

**LANIE ROBERTSON** (PLAYWRIGHT) writes about iconic artists and the societal issues they faced in *Nasty Little Secrets*, *The Insanity of Mary Girard*, *Back County Crimes*, and *Lady Day at Emerson's Bar & Grill*, which was produced on Broadway in 2014. His plays are widely produced nationally and internationally. He's a member of the Dramatists Guild, Writers Guild, East; and the Societe des Auteurs et Compositeurs Dramatiques.

**ERIC J LITTLE** (DIRECTOR) [HE/HIM] is elated to be back home at TO. He is a proud graduate of Alabama A&M University and Louisiana State University. He has worked as an actor and director with Theatrical Outfit, Actor's Express, True Colors, Aurora Theatre, Horizon Theatre, Alliance Theatre, Milwaukee Rep, North Carolina Black Rep., and others. Some of his Film/TV work as an actor includes "Tyler Perry's House of Payne," "Necessary Roughness," "The Clubhouse," "The Know Better Effect," "Stalker," Hamlet's Ghost, Lottery Ticket, Christmas Deja'Vu, Bandit; the lead in two short films Perfect Day and A Beautiful Death; and various commercials. Eric is a tenured tracked professor/Theater Coordinator at Clark Atlanta University where he also directs. Eric is also a member of the Black Theatre Network where he serves as the Parliamentarian on the Executive Board of BTN. Eric has won three Suzi Bass Awards. Eric has also been recognized as one of the "25 Rising Stars" by Atlanta Tribune Magazine, called "The Talent to Watch" by Creative Loafing, and awarded "Best Supporting Actor" by The Sunday Paper. MAT TORNEY (ARTISTIC DIRECTOR) [HE/HIM] joined Theatrical Outfit in July of 2020. Originally from Belfast, Matt worked as a freelance director in Ireland before moving to the US in 2006 to complete an MFA in directing at Columbia University. He has directed extensively in New York, regionally in the US, and internationally, and his work has been nominated for numerous awards. Before coming to TO, Matt served as Associate Artistic Director at Studio Theatre in Washington, DC for six years. His recent work includes An Iliad by Lisa Peterson & Denis O'Hare, A Hundred Words for Snow by Tatty Hennessy, Doubt by John Patrick Shanley (nominated for three Helen Hayes Awards), If I Forget by Steven Levenson (nominated for three Helen Hayes Awards), MotherStruck! by Staceyann Chin (nominated for two Helen Hayes Awards), Translations by Brian Friel, The Hard Problem by Tom Stoppard, and a ballet based on The Love Song of J Alfred Prufrock for Chamber Dance Co. THOMAS FOWLKES (INTERIM MANAGING DIRECTOR) [HE/HIM] is pleased to join the staff of Theatrical Outfit. Most recently he was General Manager of Atlanta Ballet, where in addition to managing all things related to the stage, he was at the helm of producing their brand-new Nutcracker in 2018, the Ballet's first in 20 years. Prior to Atlanta Ballet, he was Managing Director at Horizon Theatre in Little Five Points, as well as the Ballet's Director of Production. He also spent three years as a Creative Manager and Development Manager at Jamestown LP, where he played a key role in the creation of the rooftop experience at Ponce City Market. ADDAE MOON (ASSOCIATE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR) [HE/HIM] is an Atlanta based playwright, dramaturg, director, and cultural worker. He is the Associate Artistic Director at Theatrical Outfit; an Artistic Associate with Found Stages Theatre and a co-founder of the performance collective Hush Harbor Lab. Addae has served as a resident dramaturg with Working Title Playwright's Ethel Woolson Lab. He was the recipient of the 2015 International Ibsen Award for his dramaturgical work on the project Master Comic and the 2014 John Lipsky Award from the International Museum Theatre Alliance (IMTAL) for his immersive play Four Days of Fury: Atlanta 1906. Addae was also a member of Alliance Theatre's 2015-2016 Reiser Artists' Lab as co-writer on the immersive project Third Council of Lyons with Found Stages. His recent immersive co-collaborations include Frankenstein's Ball (2019/2020) and Frankenstein's Funeral (2019) both with Found Stages. As the former Literary



Manager at Horizon Theatre Company, he served as dramaturg on the early development projects for Marcus Gardley, Lauren M. Gunderson, Tanya Barfield and Janece Shaffer. Addae received his BA in Theatre Arts from Clark Atlanta University and an MFA in Playwriting from the Professional Playwright's Program at Ohio University. He is also a member of Literary Managers and Dramaturgs of America (LMDA) and The Fence Network.

**ROCHELLE SHINN** (GENERAL MANAGER) [ANY] is responsible for Theatrical Outfit's financials and business administration. Rochelle also manages Theatrical Outfit's intern program and teaches Theatrical Design and Production at GSU. She has an MFA in Scenic Design from Penn State and a BA in English from Western Michigan University. Past work experience includes Production Manager, Scenic Artist, Mask Designer, Props Designer, Stage Manager and Set Designer. 


