It has been a remarkable year for Theatrical Outfit, full of extraordinary performances by incredible Atlanta artists and a major renovation project that has breathed new life into our theater. We are thrilled to conclude the season with one of the most brilliant plays written so far in the 21st Century: *The Humans* by Stephen Karam.

I first saw this play at its premiere in New York and was absolutely blown away by the haunting beauty of the writing, the way that laughter and melancholy wove through the story, and the depth of the connections between the characters. The premise is familiar: a family gathers for Thanksgiving in their youngest daughter's new apartment in Chinatown, and as the night wears on, tensions build, and secrets are revealed that cause them to question much about their lives and relationships. However, Karam's brilliance elevates a familiar story into a powerful and tender exploration of life in 21st century America, as many familiar institutions decline, and all the characters face uncertainty and anxiety about the future.

The Humans won the TONY Award for Best Play, was nominated for the Pulitzer Prize, and has won accolades from coast to coast, and it's easy to see why. The story resonates deeply with audiences, and the sometimes surreal atmosphere of the play leaves us with powerful images of both loneliness and familial love. The play reminds us that we do not face our struggles alone and can find hope and resilience in our humanity.

We have assembled a remarkable ensemble of actors and designers for this production. Lala Cochran and Allan Edwards lead an all-star Atlanta cast as the heads of the Blake family that also includes Susan Shalhoub Larkin, Maggie Larson, Rhyn McLemore, and Tamil Periasamy. And, I have the honor of collaborating with an extremely talented group of designers that includes Scenic Design by Moriah and Isabel Curley-Clay, Costume Design by Jeff Cone, Lighting Design by Ben Rawson, Sound Design by Sharath Patel, and Properties Design & Scenic Decoration by Caroline Cook.

WE HOPE THAT YOU ENJOY THE PRODUCTION AND JOIN US FOR ANOTHER SEASON OF UNMISSABLE THEATRE IN THE HEART OF DOWNTOWN THIS COMING FALL.



Production highlights include ANNA CHRISTIE (Tony, Drama Desk, and Outer Critics Circle Awards for Best Revival), SHE LOVES ME (Outer Critics Circle, Drama Desk, and Olivier Awards for Best Revival of a Musical), NINE (Tony, Drama Desk, and Outer Critics Circle Awards for Best Revival of a Musical), ASSASSINS (Tony and Drama Desk Awards for Best Revival of a Musical), INTIMATE APPAREL (Outer Critics Circle and Audelco Awards for Best Off-Broadway Play), TWELVE ANGRY MEN (Drama Desk and Outer Critic's Circle Awards for Outstanding Revival of a Play), THE PAJAMA GAME (Tony Award for Best Revival of a Musical), and CABARET (Tony, Drama Desk, and Outer Critics Circle Awards for Best Revival of a Musical), one of the longest running musical revivals in Broadway history. Since 1995, when Roundabout expanded its repertoire to include premieres of new plays, the company has produced works by such talented writers as Brian Friel, Paula Vogel, Richard Greenberg, Lynn Nottage, Beth Henley, Harold Pinter, and Jon Robin Baitz. THE MAN WHO CAME TO DINNER, the first production at the American Airlines Theatre on 42nd Street in 2000, and the star-studded production of THE WOMEN in June 2002 have been seen on channel Thirteen/WNET and other PBS stations nationally. Beyond its work on stage, Roundabout is recognized as a national leader in audience development and offers a comprehensive program of initiatives, including the Social Series, the Early Curtain Series, the Wine Series, the Gay and Lesbian Series, HIPTIX (targeting young professionals), and related humanities events and publications. Roundabout launched ACCESS ROUNDABOUT, a program which offered over 22,000 dramatically discounted tickets during the 2007-2008 season. In addition, through arts education programs, Roundabout reaches more than 7,000 New York City public high school students and their teachers each year. With a focus on in-depth programming, these activities range from partnerships with two New Century High Schools (a NYC Department of Education Initiative) and professional development for teachers to in-school year-long residencies and student matinees at its Broadway and Off-Broadway theatres. Through national tours, live broadcasts, education and outreach programs, and its work on three stages, Roundabout touches the lives of millions of theatergoers, students, and artists across the country.


