

FRIENDS,

Welcome to an exciting new year at Theatrical Outfit.

We are honored to start 2024 with **Remember This: The Lesson of Jan Karski**, a unique and necessary piece of theater that unites exceptional artists, a powerful message, and a brilliant producing partner in the Breman Museum. This stunning production, directed by my good friend Derek Goldman, has traveled all over the United States and Europe to extraordinary acclaim, and we are thrilled to introduce it to Atlanta audiences.

The play is based on the remarkable true story of a man that served on the front lines of World War II. Jan Karski was a diplomat, a soldier, an intelligence officer in the resistance, and later became one of the leading professors of international relations at Georgetown University. He was tasked with traveling through Poland to document the state of the nation, and the suffering of its citizens under Nazi occupation. Jan was one of the first people to witness firsthand the horrors of the Holocaust, and shaken by what he had seen, he rushed to report what was happening to the Allied Nations while there was still time to do something. His story is full of heroism, intrigue, and suffering, but what makes Jan stand out is the depth of both his humility and his humanity. He refers to himself as an "insignificant little man," yet his life shares a powerful message of compassion and conscience (values he both lived during the war and taught to generations of young diplomats).

Written by Derek Goldman, who runs the Laboratory for Global Performance and Politics at Georgetown, and one of his former students, Clark Young, the play draws deeply from Jan Karski's recorded and written testimony. They capture the fine detail of his life, his words, his thoughts, and his deeds, and the essence of both his physical and moral courage. More than anything, they capture the urgency with which he compels us to make a stand against injustice and inhumanity - a message that is still deeply needed in the present day.

We are honored to partner with our friends at the Breman Museum, whose work both preserves the history of the Holocaust and also tells the story of contemporary Jewish life in the South. Their work is grounded in the "four Rs' demonstrated by Jewish people during the Holocaust: **Resourcefulness, Resistance, Rescue, and Resilience**, all of which resonate strongly with the themes of the play and the character of Jan Karski. As part of our work together, The Breman is arranging special tours of their collection to highlight the specific context of the play, helping us connect with the Jewish community here in Atlanta, and helping us facilitate post show discussions where we can all reflect on this powerful story and its resonance with today. As we begin a new year filled with political division and instability, where the complexity of the world cannot be captured by social media or partisan journalism, this production demonstrates how theatre can open up a space to engage more deeply with what it all means, and what we can do to make things better.

He is Artistic and Executive Director of The Laboratory for Global Performance & Politics (The Lab) at Georgetown University, which he cofounded in 2012 "to humanize global politics through performance." He is Professor of Theater and Performance Studies and of Global Performance, Culture and Politics in the School of Foreign Service. He has directed over 100 theatrical productions and has worked regularly as a playwright/adapter at leading off-Broadway, international, and regional theaters such as Steppenwolf in Chicago; Shakespeare Theater Company, Kennedy Center, Arena Stage, Ford's Theater, Lincoln Center and Theater for A New Audience, Chicago Shakespeare, Berkeley Rep, Baltimore CenterStage and many others, as well as throughout the world. *Remember This* which has been

performed with David Strathairn to great acclaim off-Broadway and at leading theaters throughout the US as well as in the UK, Spain, and 4 cities in Poland. He also co-directed and co-authored the feature film version which has received awards at numerous festivals and aired nationally on PBS Great Performances. He created *In Your Shoes*, a groundbreaking approach to counter polarization by using innovative techniques rooted in theatrical performance, dialogue and deep listening which has engaged thousands of participants in diverse settings and contexts around the world.

Originally from Belfast, Matt worked as a freelance director in Ireland before moving to the US in 2006 to complete an MFA in directing at Columbia University. 




