

#### FRIENDS,

We are thrilled to welcome you to another Atlanta premiere at Theatrical Outfit! After a smash hit production on Broadway in 2021, *Clyde's* has been lighting up stages all across the country, and it is wonderful to see it here with an all-star Atlanta cast and creative team.

Lynn Nottage is one of the greatest living American playwrights who has won two Pulitzer Prizes for drama, for *Ruined* in 2009, and *Sweat* in 2017. Her plays are vividly imagined, and feature unforgettable characters, often overcoming obstacles in tough situations. She experiments with form, from the poetic realism of *Intimate Apparel*, to the bold and highly physicalized structure of *Mlima's Tale*. She is interested in connections between people, place, and stories, and how the shifting perspectives of live theatre can open up new ways of seeing and being.

Clyde's is a companion piece to her play Sweat, and explores what happens when a character who was incarcerated in Sweat is released from prison. The only place he can get a job is a seemingly dead-end diner at a truck stop in Pennsylvania with other formerly incarcerated people. In more predictable hands, this would become the backdrop to an intense drama about an unforgiving society, but Lynn Nottage is interested in a bigger question: how can we find redemption when everyone has given up on us? Cooking becomes a pathway to creativity as these people seek self-knowledge and healing, and form a community of resistance against the cynicism of their ruthless boss, Clyde. As Nottage said in the New York Times, "it is about the processes of resurrecting one's spirit, and finding grace in the simple business of living."

Joining Tonia Jackson in the role of Clyde is an all-star ensemble of Atlanta actors (including Geoffrey Williams last seen here in *Thurgood*), and a brilliant creative team led by January LaVoy (who co-directed and starred in *Fires in the Mirror*). These artists are all digging deep into the hope and joy of this troubled world and are capturing lightning in a bottle at Theatrical Outfit.

We hope to see you at TO again in May for our scorching revival of Edward Albee's Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?!

Recent work includes the book for *MJ the Musical* (Broadway), the libretto for the *Intimate Apparel Opera* (LCT), and *Clyde's* (Broadway, 2ST, Goodman Theatre), and co-curating the performance installation *The Watering Hole* (Signature Theatre). Past work includes *Sweat*, *Ruined*, the book for *The Secret Life of Bees*; *Mlima's Tale*; *By the Way, Meet Vera Stark*; *Intimate Apparel*; *Fabulation*, or the *Re-Education of Undine*; *Crumbs from the Table of Joy*; *Las Meninas*; *Mud, River, Stone*; *Por'knockers*; and *POOF!*. She has also developed This is Reading, a performance installation in Reading, Pennsylvania. Ms. Nottage is a member of the Theater Hall of Fame, and the recipient of a MacArthur "Genius Grant" Fellowship (among other awards). 
