

FRIENDS,

Welcome to the closing show of our 23/24 season!

Edward Albee's Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf? exploded onto the Broadway stage in 1963, and has been igniting conversations at theaters across the country ever since. Audiences had never seen anything quite like Albee's fearless exploration of marriage and nature of truth, and had never met characters quite like George and Martha. The play was hilarious, and also heartbreaking; absurd, and also deeply real; and it established the young playwright as a major force in world theatre.

The play takes place in the town of New Carthage, the home of a revered ivy-covered college. Martha is the daughter of the College President, and George is her disappointing husband, who has been treading water as an Associate Professor in the history department for over 20 years. On this particular night, they invite a new young professor and his wife for a late-night drink at their house. As they drink, talk, squabble, dance, rage, laugh and cry, the masks they wear to protect themselves from the world are shaken free, and we get a glimpse into the dark and vulnerable truths that lurk beneath.

Encountering the play again in 2024 offers a fresh new lens on the story. In this age of misinformation and mistrust, a play about truthfulness feels both urgent and exciting. Albee's laser focus on the absurd anxieties of the American middle class, and the failure of its illusions, resonate keenly with the current social climate. Through its sharp humor and biting intelligence, Woolf jolts us into an awareness of our deep human need for love and safety (even if we need to fight to get it).

This is an actor's play, and we are thrilled to bring together some of the city's finest actors in a dream cast for this show! Atlanta theatre legends Tess Malis Kincaid and Steve Coulter play Martha and George, and they are joined by the blazing talents of Justin Walker as Nick, and Devon Hales as Honey. They are supported by a wonderful creative team of TO veterans, led by our Artistic Director, Matt Torney.

We hope you enjoy the show! And, we cannot wait to welcome you back during our exciting 24/25 season (see the back cover for the exciting announcement)!



EDWARD ALBEE (*Playwright*) (1928-2016) was born on March 12, 1928, and began writing plays 30 years later. His plays include *The Zoo Story* (1958), *The American Dream* (1960), *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf*? (1961-62, Tony Award), *Tiny Alice* (1964), *A Delicate Balance* (1966, Pulitzer Prize and Tony Award), *All Over* (1971), *Seascape* (1974, Pulitzer Prize), *The Lady From Dubuque* (1977-78), *The Man Who Had Three Arms* (1981), *Finding The Sun* (1982), *Marriage Play* (1986-87), *Three Tall Women* (1991, Pulitzer Prize), *Fragments* (1993), *The Play About The Baby* (1997), *The Goat, or Who Is Sylvia*? (2000, 2002, Tony Award), *Occupant* (2001), *Peter and Jerry*: Act 1, *Homelife*; Act 2, *The Zoo Story* (2004), and *Me, Myself and I* (2007). He was a member of the Dramatists Guild Council and President of The Edward F. Albee Foundation. Mr. Albee was awarded the Gold Medal in Drama from the American Academy and Institute of Arts and Letters in 1980, and in 1996 received the Kennedy Center Honors and the National Medal of Arts. In 2005 he was awarded the special Tony Award for Lifetime Achievement.

MATT TORNEY (*Director*) [HE/HIM] joined Theatrical Outfit in July of 2020. Originally from Belfast, Matt worked as a freelance director in Ireland before moving to the US in 2006 to complete an MFA in directing at Columbia University.
